The proposed renovation will give the Noyes Library universal access for the first time and will expand the library within the cherished historic building!

The plan is to expand the 975 square foot library upward and downward to create three levels of beautiful space within the existing envelope of the building, all to further the Library's mission of connecting children and their families to the world of books.

Upstairs, the attic will be renovated to accommodate programming space, so specialized programs can be conducted while the library is open. There will be a small stage for performers and the room will be filled with light from a new window, which will look out on to the Warner Mansion.

Have another look at the illustration on page 1. The plan is to add an imaginative Rapunzel-style tower on one side of the library to house the elevator, and connect with a glass breezeway to the attic level.

Downstairs, a basement will be dug to house workspace for the librarians, plus two fully accessible bathrooms. Presently, a huge portion of the main floor is taken up by librarian workspace. Moving the workspace downstairs means that the library's main floor can be returned to the traditional reading room layout of the early days. The focus of the librarian's desk will be to serve the public and the desk will again stand in front of the fireplace, the place it used to be in the library's early days.

At the moment, the library is open three days a week: Tuesday, Thursday, and Saturday, from 9-5, and for special programs on Wednesdays by appointment. The renovation will mean that library hours can be extended.

Throughout this Noyes Birthday Year, there will be an array of special events for children, including a series of readings by celebrities and authors. Twenty years ago, Noyes librarians sponsored a program to celebrate the library's 100<sup>th</sup> birthday, encouraging children to read 100 books each. Many children did. Each child received a special medal in a ceremony. This time, the number of books to read will be increased to 120!

### Gala Artisan Jewelry & Gifts 10417 Armory Avenue, Kensington

Open since September 2012, Gala brings a wonderful variety of jewelry, accessories, pottery, art glass, toys, and gifts to Kensington, each handmade and unique. The community has been incredibly welcoming and customers are thrilled to discover the shop, a perfect place for an inspired quick gift.

Gala is across from the Kensington Safeway, right between JennyCakes Bakery and Two Pears Café. Owners Linda Blackbourn and Barbara Catrett are both jewelers and had long wanted to open a store together. When they saw the shop, it was a perfect match.

GALA gets its name from Guild of Artists Local to the Area and the business works somewhat like a co-op. Local artists consign their work and can volunteer their time at the shop in return for a better rate. Customers enjoy being helped by one of the artists and some come back especially when they know a particular artist will be there.

One recent Thursday evening, Ann Stone was minding the store. (Businesses in Kensington's Old Town are open till 8 p.m. on the third Thursday of each month.) Stone works with textiles and is a potter. She happily explained the locker hooking technique she uses to make colorful, cushy rugs and trivets. It is a simple, old-fashioned technique.

On a visit to London, Ann was locker hooking a project while waiting for her train at King's Cross Station. An older gentleman from Yorkshire noticed and told her how his grandmother had those rugs in her kitchen years ago and he had not seen them since.

Locker hooking makes use of fabric scraps; several of the artists re-use materials for their creations, including deconstructed leather coats, banner scraps, sweaters, and more. A visit to the shop is inspiring. Linda and Barbara

plan to offer workshops for the community soon. Opening hours are Tuesday through Saturday 10 a.m. to 6 p.m., Sunday noon to 5 p.m. and till 8 p.m. each third Thursday. For more visit www.galaartisans.com or call 301-933-2912.
