

## The Noyes Children's Library

"No, Yes" say the new readers as they spy the sign over the door of the tiny, gabled building on Carroll Place and Montgomery Avenue in Old Kensington. The "No-Yes" Noyes Children's Library is at home in the oldest public library in the Washington area. Crosby Noyes, editor and publisher of the Washington Evening Star, and Brainerd Warner, the developer of the original Town of Kensington, led a group of farsighted Kensington residents who built and stocked the library in 1893.

Originally a community library under a private board of trustees, Noyes Library

became a part of the countywide public library system in 1951. In 1970, it became the county's first and only children's library. Its special mission was to develop innovative ideas and programs that could be shared with the children's rooms in other libraries; to build a special collection highlighting recreation, creativity, and enrichment; and to provide staff outreach to children who cannot easily attend public library programs.

This year, 1993, marks the 100th Birthday

of the much-loved landmark.


This fun and free program is co-sponsored by The Montgomery County Medical Society Auxiliary, The Foundation for Health Education, and The Montgomery County Health Department.






