# The Kensington Volunteer Fire Department Shows Up for Us!

The Kensington Volunteer Fire Department (KVFD) is there for our community in so many ways, from the commonplace to the extraordinary.

One afternoon a couple of years ago, Ambulance 705 reposnded to the report of someone in cardiac arrest. They arrived on the scene to find the man blue in the face and not breathing. They initiated CPR and he was defibrillated. Then Medic 723 and Paramedic Engine 725 arrived and followed ALS (Advanced Life Support) protocols. Spontaneous circulation returned. They then transported the man to a local hospital.

The A705 crew that day were FF M. Mathieu, EMT C. Persaud, Prob. Hernandez, and Admin H Mekhonen. They were later honored for their actions.

Nothing meant as much to them, they later said, as seeing this same man walk in to Station 5 one Sunday afternoon, healthy and smiling. In lay terms, this man had been brought back from the dead. He had come to express his gratitude to KVFD Station 5—he thanked them for saving his life.

#### **KVFD** Loan Closet

Do you know that the Kensington Volunteer Fire Department (KVFD) has a loan closet?

The loan closet is run by the KVFD Auxiliary and serves the public from all over Montgomery County. It is open Mondays from 6:30 to 7:30 p.m.

Available for loan are full-size wheel chairs (not electric), transport wheelchairs, bedside commodes, metal walkers, Rollators (sit-down walkers), canes, knee rollers (for after foot surgeries), and toilet toppers.

Crutches are no longer available, since hospitals provide these when you leave. Neither are hospital beds for health reasons. Call (301) 929-8000 to find out more.

# **Mid-Atlantic Military Antiques**

Tim Frank is a military historian, and a collector and dealer of military antiques. Frank began collecting when he was 10 years old. His father would take him to museums and estate sales. His grandfather gave him his World War II service medals. From then on he was hooked on history.

Mid-Atlantic Military Antiques is Frank's antiques and research business. His expertise ranges from the Civil War through Vietnam and the present.

Frank urges veterans to write down the stories behind the artifacts they have kept. "I always encourage veterans to talk to all their family members, because you never know if a child or grandchild might have an interest."

It is important to keep the citations with the military medals. Without the citation the history of their family member's service is lost. Frank points out that only the person who was awarded a military medal may wear that medal.

As a historian and collector, Frank is interested in buying whatever families do not want to keep.
